Notice to Stakeholders regarding 2018/19 Discretionary Grant Funding Applications

This notice serves to update all stakeholders still awaiting feedback or site visits in relation to INSETA 2018/19 Discretionary Grant Funding applications.

We have unfortunately encountered some challenges in the manual processing of Discretionary Grant funding application. After much delay we have finalised all allocations that immediately meet compliance requirements. Those applications that still require additional compliance actions such as company registration or site visits, were not all processed in time for 2018/19 financial allocation.

We are therefore informing all stakeholders that have not yet received positive feedback of allocation or processing, that no further allocations can now be made for 2018/19 and all pending applications will be considered as closed.

An opportunity to apply again will be made available in April or May 2019 for 2019/20 Discretionary funds. This process will be automated and therefore be quicker and more reliable.
