## **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EOI) TO PUBLIC TVET COLLEGES TO ACCESS FUNDING TO PROVIDE SKILLS PROGRAMME TO UNEMPLOYED YOUTH 2022/23**

The Insurance Sector Education and Training Authority (INSETA) is funding skills programmes to train unemployed youth (nationally) during the 2022/23 financial year. The application window for 2022/23 Financial Year is now open from **08 November 2021 and applications will be accepted until 30 November 2021**

The Funded programmes as below:

### **Programme 1**

#### **INSETA Introduction to Insurance Short Skills Programme:**

- Compliance & Risk: Program Code – CR49929
- The Sales Process: Program Code – WSP49929

Learners eligible for Programme:

- N6 Business Studies learners who have completed their theoretical Component in the following disciplines: (Business Management, Financial Management, Sales and Marketing Management and Human Resource Management and Management Assistant)

## Programme 2

### Other Short Skills Programmes aligning to the INSETA scarce and critical skills:

- Artificial Intelligence
- Digitilization
- Data Analytics
- CyberSecurity

Learners eligible for Programme:

- Level 4 Information Technology Learners who have completed their final year successfully.

### ***Please note:***

- ***(Programme 1) It is a requirement that the TVET College should have valid INSETA Accreditation for the skills-programme***
- ***(Programme2) The TVET College may appoint a service provider to offer any of the above-mentioned skills programmes or utilize their own accreditation***

This EOI seeks to source public TVET Colleges in every province who can deliver training for the above programmes. The INSETA Introduction to Insurance Short Skills Programme is open to TVET Colleges that are duly accredited by INSETA to offer training for applicable Unit Standards ***as per Eoi Response Form***. TVET Colleges can register any unemployed learner that meets the minimum entry requirements (***as stated in the eligibility of Learners***).

TVET College meeting the above requirements and can deliver any of the listed interventions, adhere to the below deliverables:

- Recruitment of unemployed youth that will participate in the training interventions as applied for.
- Provision of all applicable course related administration and logistical activities which are pertinent to the successful roll out of the training before, during and after the training intervention.
- Related to INSETA Introduction to Insurance Short Skills programme, provision of related ETQA accreditation valid for the project duration.

- Related to the other Short Skills Programme that a TVET College is not accredited for, a TVET must indicate specific skills programmes (from the list above) and number of learners they apply for. INSETA will appoint an accredited service provider to offer that skills programme.
- Implementing relevant assessments, moderation, verifications and issuing of learner statement of credits to all learners found competent (certification).
- Provision of refreshments/catering services for learners for the duration of training in line with funding breakdown as awarded.
- Provision of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to learners recruited for the project i.e. face masks, hand sanitizers etc to comply with requirements of Covid-19.
- Administration and disbursement of learner stipends in line with funding breakdown as awarded.
- Attend a pre-implementation briefing session for the awarded TVET Colleges arranged by INSETA to prepare for the delivery of the training. This briefing will be conducted virtually using a face-to-face session may be arranged where necessary (taking into consideration compliance with COVID-19 regulations).

**Programmes will be funded per learner (all inclusive) as follows:**

- Tuition Fee – (maximum 10 training days) at a maximum of R5 500.00 per learner
- Learner Stipend – (maximum 10 days) at R100.00 per day

**Please note:**

TVET College applications will be approved subject to their compliance with the above-mentioned requirements. No TVET College will be considered for funding outside of this process.
