	conducting new research (short surveys/interviews/workshops), desktop studies, and provide
	this information to the INSETA Content Writers and assist in the write-up of the INSETA Sector
	Skills Research plan (SSP). The Researchers and Content Writers (INSETAs own Content
	Writers), will be required to work hand in hand to ensure that INSETA receive a credible
	research document which is in-line with the SSP Framework set out by the Department of
	Higher Education and Training (DHET).
Funding Window Opened	30 th January 2023 and will close on 17 th February 2023.
Contract Duration	The contract for the new service provider shall be committed over a period of two (2) years,
	subject to a renewal each year which will be dependent on performance.
Eligibility Criteria for Service Provider	The service provider must provide the INSETA with a Lead Researcher with the following
	qualifications and experience:
	Minimum of a Master's Degree in any of the related fields of Social Sciences, Education,
	Economics or Statistics.
	 Have experience in writing for either the education / financial / insurance industry. (5+ years)
	The Lead Researcher must have done previous research in the Insurance and Financial
	Related Services sector and understand the sectoral needs / published papers or
	reports for the sector.
	Knowledge and experience of skills development programmes.
	 Excellent communication and report writing skills.



	 Lead Researcher must have completed two (2) SSP or Research reports in any of the related fields of Social Sciences, Education, Economics, Statistics or related field. NB: Experience should be in a table format with contactable references, for example: Name of institution, title of the study, year conducted, year completed, and purpose of the study, contactable reference name, and contact details. Contact details must include telephone number and e-mail address. Must submit minimum of (3) Reference Letters relevant to the project and contactable client that was serviced in the past years.
	 The proposal must include: The CVs of researchers who will form part of the research team for the Sector Skills
	 Plan; Areas of expertise in the specified fields; Plan outlining research methodology and project outputs Funding plan in relation to a project plan

Contract Scope/Funding Covers	The INSETA will draw up a Service Level Agreement (SLA), with the service provider and a proposed model/plan will be negotiated and approved on the project. The service provider will deliver the full Sector Skills Plan (SSP) for financial year 2023/24. (SSP Draft – 14/05/2023 Final SSP – 30/07/2023). The SLA will then be renewed for the following year with an addendum to extend the contract dependent on performance.
In Scope	The overall responsibility of the deliverables will lie with the Research Institution (Service Provider). The Service Provider will be expected to write up the Sector Skills Plan according to



	the criteria and guidelines as set out by the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET).
	The Service Provider will be responsible for:
	 Ensuring the DHET Sector Skills Plan Framework and Guidelines are followed accurately and make certain that all research deliverables are met. Drafting a Research plan with deadline dates in accordance with the DHET Framework and guidelines. Ensuring that all areas of research being conducted will address the Six Chapters of the Sector Skills Plan which includes:
	 Chapter 1: Sector Profile Chapter 2: Key Skills Change Drivers Chapter 3: Occupational Shortages and Skills Gaps Chapter 4: Sector Partnerships Chapter 5: SETA Monitoring and Evaluation Chapter 6: Strategic Skills Priority Actions
	In addition, other critical tasks include:
	 Collating all primary and secondary data for all the Sector Skills Plan chapters. Assisting with a statistical trends analysis. Analysing the INSETA workplace skills plan/annual training report (WSP/ATR) data to feed into the research report.



	4. Interviewing all INSETA divisions to identify, the INSETA goals and mandates within each
	division and projects/partnerships underway and progress made in these areas for the purpose of reporting into the Sector Skills plan.
	5. Facilitating a maximum of six (6) focus group sessions to identify sectoral needs and requirements to incorporate into the research report.
	6. Looking at the INSETA Strategic Plan and Annual Performance plan and the alignment of these into the SSP.
	7. Consulting with professional bodies and industry associations for the purpose of the research.
	8. Assisting INSETA in identifying the Top scarce and critical skills identified by the sector and provide sound research to support these scarce skills needs. Provide research around the extent of skills mismatches in the sector.
	9. Referring to the Government priorities as linked to the SETA and it's mandate and determine the fit through supporting research and contribute to the Research Agenda of INSETA.
	10. Referring to other key Government documents, i.e Skills Development Act, NDP, NSDP, NGP, HRD Strategy and White Paper on Post Schooling.
	11. Providing a summary on INSETA's main Skills Priorities and Actions required, stemming from the research outcomes.
	12. Writing up the INSETA Continuous Improvement Plan (CIP) according to the specifications provided by the DHET.
